Some things that would be helpful to our school staff in order to assist us with the smooth operations on busy ski days:

Please help your child get to school on time (everyday), but on Mondays during ski season in particular. Late arrivals place an additional burden on the office staff and all of the student learning happens between 9 and 11am on Mondays, we do not want them to miss out!. Please use the digital or paper checklist to help your child(ren) double check that they have all of the equipment and clothing they need for safe/fun skiing and boarding. Please put your child's name on ALL pieces of their equipment and clothing.

Please send your child with a snack in their coat or snow pants pocket for a snack at the mountain. (If your child does not have a snack when they get to school, we will have a few extras on hand).

Please send your child with a disposable or reusable water bottle.

If you need to make changes to your child's dismissal plan please email or call the school BEFORE 9am on Mondays unless it is an emergency.

We do not have any school staff on duty at the mountain past 3:30pm, please plan to pick your child up at the Arlberg Lodge Children's Center between 3:00 and 3:15 if they are not riding the bus home or to after school program.

#### CLASSROOM GUIDANCE UPDATES

Students in grades 1-6 participated in classroom guidance lessons centered around ski and boarding safety.

C.L.O.V.E.R.S.:

C- Control - ski / board in control

L - Lifts - stay safe on the lifts

O- Overtaking - be careful passing

V - Visible - be aware of surroundings

E - Entering - look both ways when entering a trail

R- Respect - show respect at the mountain (Whitaker Woods for nordic)

S - Signs - follow all signs

Grade 6: Conflict Resolution, Ski /






# Ski Days are here!
